



BEHAVIORAL THREAT ASSESSMENT & MANAGEMENT

In this 8-hour course, you will learn a threat assessment-intervention model that can be used by educators, law enforcement officers, mental health professionals, and others involved in school safety. It outlines a methodical procedure for evaluating a threat and the person making the threat. This class will show how to reach an informed judgment on the danger of a threat and how to manage the one making the threat.

The basic threat assessment course includes:

- Understanding the motivation behind threats
- Identifying behavior and personality traits that can lead to violent behavior
- The multi-disciplinary team approach
- Intervention process and threat management
- How to conduct a threat assessment interview
- Case study review
- Role-play and tabletop scenarios
